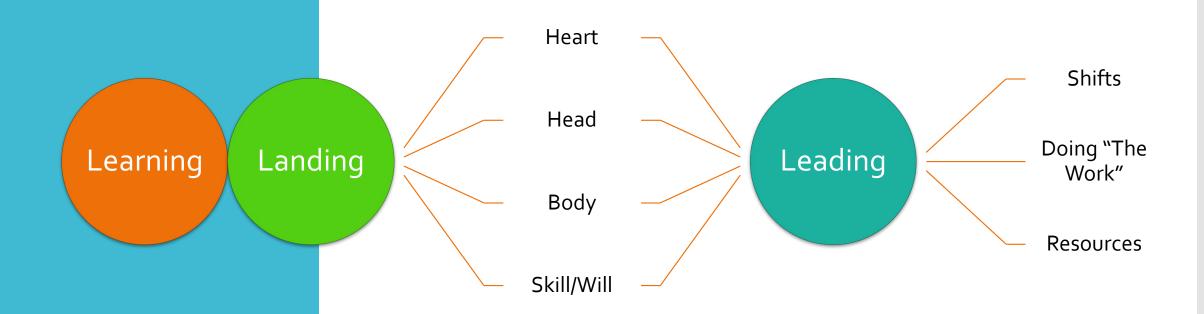
Key Concepts

Term	Key Question	Example
Diversity	Who's in the room?	Race, Gender, Ability, Worldview
Equity	Who has access? Resources, proximity to power, representation	Pipeline to leadership within the organization, materials/access to support in other languages, decision making panels
Inclusion	How are the identities/perspective of others represented, accounted for, and valued in a way that shares power?	Process, decision making, work products
Culture	What meaning and customs assure adaptation, survival, and thrival?	Personal space Individualism or collectivism Planned or emergent
Bias	Who we inherently assume is?	professionalism in charge in the know/capable needing help or the helper

Key Concepts

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Justice	What is a reasonable expectation of fairness in this setting?	Policy and rules enforcement/adherence Ongoing/open examination of how expectations and standards are determined Cross-cuts accountability and ethics
Systemic Racism	What aspects of history, culture and society contribute to inequality?	Generational implications supported by data (school-to-prison pipeline) Race constructed paradigms (redlining)
Anti-Racism	What are the policies/practices in institutions that mirror and reinforce beliefs, attitudes, prejudice, stereotyping and/or discrimination towards specific people groups?	Examination of culture (organizational and societal), oppression and its impacts
Ally	How can I commit to recognizing my privilege (based on gender, class, race, sexual identity, etc.) and work in solidarity with oppressed groups for justice?	Focus is the individual doing their own work
Accomplice	How can we/together dismantle harmful structures and create a renewed sense of community?	Focus is the collective working together under the direction of those most marginalized
