RESOLUTION NO. 41350

A RESOLUTION setting Tuesday, February 20, 2024, upon completion of Regular Agenda Items, no earlier than 5:15 p.m., as the date for a public hearing by the City Council on the consideration for extending an existing moratorium on certain uses within the South Tacoma Groundwater Protection District, as recommended by the Infrastructure, Planning, and Sustainability Committee.

WHEREAS the City Council adopted Amended Substitute Resolution No. 40985, on June 28, 2022, approving the Work Plan for the South Tacoma Ground Protection District ("STGPD") Code Amendments, and directed the Planning Commission to conduct a public process to develop findings of fact and recommendations as to whether a moratorium on heavy industrial uses and storage of hazardous materials within the STGPD is warranted, and

WHEREAS the City Council's initiation of the STGPD moratorium consideration was in response to public comments received by the Planning Commission and the City Council during the review and adoption processes for the 2022 Annual Amendment to the Comprehensive Plan, and

WHEREAS the Planning Commission conducted four meetings in response to public comments regarding the moratorium, and

WHEREAS the Planning Commission completed its review and deliberations of the matter through a public process, and forwarded its Findings of Fact and Recommendations Report, along with a letter of recommendation, to the City Council for consideration on August 17, 2022, and

WHEREAS a summary of this recommendation is as follows:

(1) That the City Council consider enacting a targeted and specific moratorium on the establishment of the following uses: Underground storage



tanks; Metal recycling/auto wrecking; Vehicle service and repair; Vehicle service and repair – industrial; (2) That the moratorium should additionally limit the expansion of existing facilities but allow for normal maintenance, repair, and replacement activities of existing uses; and (3) The duration of the moratorium should apply initially for a period of one year, to be resolved through the STGPD code update, and

WHEREAS, in response, the City Council referred the recommendation to the Infrastructure, Planning, and Sustainability ("IPS") Committee for further consideration, and following that referral, the IPS Committee, on November 30, 2022, approved the following amendments to the Planning Commission proposal, and forwarded the amended moratorium proposal to the City Council:

- 1. <u>Use Categories</u>: The IPS Committee did not find sufficient risk to groundwater resources from the establishment or expansion of vehicle service and repair, or industrial vehicle service and repair uses to warrant a moratorium. Therefore, the moratorium should apply only to the metal recycling/auto wrecking and underground storage tanks;
- 2. Expansion of Existing Uses: The IPS Committee found that a moratorium that is too restrictive on the expansion of existing uses could have the counter effect of prohibiting improvements that provide environmental benefit or reduce the risks and impacts of existing uses. Therefore, the moratorium should allow for reasonable facility and site development that improves environmental outcomes while avoiding the introduction of new risks to the City's groundwater resources, and



WHEREAS, on March 7, 2023, the City Council adopted Ordinance No. 28872, enacting a moratorium on certain uses within the STGPD as recommended by the IPS Committee, and

WHEREAS the moratorium in Ordinance No. 28872 became effective March 20, 2023, and was enacted for an initial period of up to one year, to expire on March 20, 2024, and

WHEREAS, on December 20, 2023, the Planning Commission affirmed an updated timeline to complete the STGPD code review concurrent with the One Tacoma Plan update, scheduled to be completed by mid-2025, and

WHEREAS, the initial moratorium was intended to be in effect for the duration of the STGPD code review and amendment process, and

WHEREAS the City desires to fix a time and date for public hearing for the purpose of considering the proposed extension of the existing moratorium on certain uses within the STGPD; Now, Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:

Section 1. That Tuesday, February 20, 2024, upon completion of Regular Agenda Items, no earlier than 5:15 p.m., is hereby fixed as the time, and the City Council Chambers on the First Floor of the Tacoma Municipal Building, 747 Market Street, Tacoma, Washington, and may be offered in a hybrid format that includes a remote option, as the place when and where a public hearing shall be held on the extension of the moratorium on certain uses within the South Tacoma Groundwater Protection District, as recommended by the Infrastructure, Planning, and Sustainability Committee.

WHEREAS the Citizen Commission on Elected Salaries ("Commission") shall consist of seven members appointed as follows: five members, one from each City Council district, selected by lot by the Pierce County Auditor from registered City of Tacoma voters eligible to vote at the time of selection; and two members who are residents of the City of Tacoma, to be appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by the City Council, one with experience in human resource management and the other with experience in the legal profession, and

WHEREAS a vacancy exists on the Commission, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to City Charter Section 2.3, Alexandra Abplanalp has been selected by the Auditor to serve on the Commission; Now, Therefore,

That Alexandra Abplanalp is hereby confirmed and appointed as a member of the Citizen Commission on Elected Salaries, for the Council District No. 3 position, to expire September 30, 2026.

RESOLUTION NO. 41352

A RESOLUTION relating to the multi-family property tax exemption program; authorizing the execution of a Multi-Family Housing 12-Year Limited Property Tax Exemption Agreement with 709 E 34th Street LLC and Farrow Real Estate Holdings LLC, for the development of 12 multi-family market-rate and affordable rental housing units to be located at 709 East 34th Street in the McKinley Mixed-Use Center.

WHEREAS the City has, pursuant to Chapter 84.14 of the Revised Code of Washington, designated several Residential Target Areas for the allowance of a limited property tax exemption for new multi-family residential housing, and

WHEREAS the City has, through Ordinance No. 25789, enacted a program whereby property owners in Residential Target Areas may qualify for a Final Certificate of Tax Exemption which certifies to the Pierce County

Assessor-Treasurer that the owner is eligible to receive a limited property tax exemption, and

WHEREAS 709 E 34th Street LLC and Farrow Real Estate Holdings LLC are proposing to develop 12 new market-rate and affordable rental housing units to consist of:

WHEREAS the affordable units will be rented to households whose income is at or below 70 percent of Pierce County Area Median Income, adjusted for household size, as determined by the Department of Housing and Urban



Development on an annual basis, and rent will be capped at 30 percent of those income levels, adjusted annually, and

WHEREAS the project will also include five on-site residential parking stalls, and

WHEREAS the Director of Community and Economic Development has reviewed the proposed property tax exemption and recommends that a conditional property tax exemption be awarded for the property located at 709 East 34th Street in the McKinley Mixed-Use Center, as more particularly described in the attached Exhibit "A"; Now, Therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:

Section 1. That the City Council does hereby approve and authorize a conditional property tax exemption, for a period of 12 years, to 709 E 34th Street LLC and Farrow Real Estate Holdings LLC, for the property located at 709 East 34th Street in the McKinley Mixed-Use Center, as more particularly described in the attached Exhibit "A."

RESOLUTION NO. 41353

A RESOLUTION relating to collective bargaining; authorizing the execution of a Letter of Agreement negotiated between the City of Tacoma and the Tacoma Firefighters Union, Local 31, regarding 2023 Christmas holiday scheduling.

WHEREAS the City has, for years, adopted the policy of collective bargaining between the various labor organizations representing employees and the administration, and

WHEREAS Resolution No. 41148, adopted March 7, 2023, authorized the execution of the three-year Collective Bargaining Agreement ("CBA") between the City of Tacoma and the Tacoma Firefighters Union, Local 31 ("Union"), on behalf of the employees represented by said Union, and

WHEREAS the City and Union have negotiated a Letter of Agreement ("LOA") to the CBA which provides for the following: (1) allowing employees to volunteer for overtime at least 48 hours in advance of the holiday to fill schedule vacancies for Christmas Day of 2023, and (2) as an incentive to volunteers, and to avoid or minimize mandatory overtime of Christmas Day of 2023, employees who volunteer will be paid at double time rate for work performed on Christmas Day of 2023, and

WHEREAS it appears in the best interest of the City that the LOA negotiated by said Union and the City be approved; Now, Therefore,



BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:

That the proper officers of the City are hereby authorized to execute the Letter of Agreement negotiated between the City of Tacoma and the Tacoma Firefighters Union, Local 31, said document to be substantially in the form of the document on file in the office of the City Clerk.

RESOLUTION NO. 41354

BY REQUEST OF COUNCIL MEMBERS DANIELS, RUMBAUGH, AND WALKER

A RESOLUTION authorizing the one-time use of funds in the amount of \$10,000, budgeted from the Council Contingency Fund, to support the distribution of 500 Raising Girls winter care bags with essential hygiene items and winter warm items to youth and young adults in the City.

WHEREAS the Raising Girls non-profit organization ("Raising Girls"), as a trusted community resource, partners with schools and local organizations to address hygiene insecurity and period poverty by providing and distributing care bags with essential products to elementary, middle, and high school students and young adults in need in the Puget Sound area, and

WHEREAS this sponsorship will allow Raising Girls to improve the health and well-being of students, encourage school attendance, and promote pride and dignity among young people by providing 500 students with hygiene products and winter warm items, and

WHEREAS Raising Girls has purchased, packed, and distributed more than 12,000 care bags to date and has partnered with nearly 97 schools, the Boys and Girls Clubs, Metro Parks, Eastside Community Center, People's Center, and the Tacoma Urban League, and

WHEREAS Raising Girls mainly focuses on schools that have the highest free and reduced lunch percentages, enabling them to support those most in need, and

WHEREAS youths who cannot afford hundreds of dollars a year on menstrual products often resort to problematic alternatives such as toilet paper,



paper towels, fast food napkins, rags, and socks or extend the use of menstrual products, and

WHEREAS the lack of access to proper and sufficient menstrual hygiene products can lead to health issues, infections, and toxic shock syndrome, and can also lead to anxiety and depression at a critical time in a young person's development, and

WHEREAS furthermore those who lack access to proper menstrual hygiene products are often absent from school during their periods, which is detrimental to their education, and

WHEREAS without proper period protection, students can become reluctant to participate in important confidence-building activities in the classroom, on the sports field, and in other extra-curricular school programs at a critical time in their development, and

WHEREAS each winter care bag costs approximately \$20.00 and contains full-sized hygiene supplies, including menstrual products, body wash, deodorant, shampoo, conditioner, toothpaste, toothbrush brush, lotion, washcloths, and also includes warm hats, scarves, socks, and gloves, and

WHEREAS Raising Girls includes menstrual hygiene information and handwritten notes of love reminding young people to feel pride in who they are, and

WHEREAS, at the January 23, 2024, Study Session, Council Members

Daniels, Rumbaugh and Walker shared a Council Consideration Request to

authorize the one-time use of \$10,000, from the Council Contingency Fund for the



distribution of 500 Raising Girls winter care bags with essential hygiene items and warm winter items to youth and young adults in the City, and

WHEREAS City staff will execute a one-time donation in support of Raising Girls "winter care bags", and

WHEREAS RCW 35.34.250 and 35.34.260 authorize a withdrawal from the Council Contingency Fund for any municipal expense, the necessity or extent of which could not have been foreseen or reasonably evaluated at the time of adopting the budget, and

WHEREAS Ordinance No. 22569 requires an affirmative vote of not less than six members of the Council in order to withdraw moneys from this fund; Now, Therefore.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TACOMA:

Section 1. That one-time funding in the amount of \$10,000, budgeted from the Council Contingency Fund, is hereby approved for the purpose of supporting the distribution of 500 winter care bags with essential hygiene items and warm winter items to youth and young adults in the City.

Section 8. That Section 1 is effective retroactive to January 1, 2023; Section 2 is effective retroactive to January 1, 2024; Section 3 is effective July 1, 2024; Section 4 is effective January 1, 2025, Section 5 is effective July 1, 2025; and Sections 6 and 7 are effective as provided by law.
