

Climate Impacts


- More very hot days

- Reduced agriculture yields


2019 TACOMA COMMUNITY EMISSIONS




PAST & FUTURE EMISSIONS (TACOMA)

DRAFT 2030 LCS MILESTONES

LCS Milestones

- Only 12% of new homes are built are single family and almost all near corridors and mixed-use centers
- 100% of new builds are built to net zero carbon standards
- 12% of existing commercial buildings are retrofit to net zero carbon
- 7% of existing industrial buildings floor space is retrofit to net zero carbon
- Almost twice as many people need to take transit and shift to bicycling and walking than do now.
- 100% new passenger vehicle sales are EV
- 30% of transit zero emission
- Ferries electrified
- Per capita waste generation reduced by 18%

Call to Order

This meeting was called to order by Commission Chair Lexi Brewer at 5:05pm, including an acknowledgement of the occupied indigenous lands this Commission conducts its business on. The Chair welcomed Commissioners, staff, and members of the public and shared virtual meeting practices and requirements.

No public comment was delivered in writing or given in meeting.

Staff Updates

Patrick Babbitt, the Commission's staff liaison, recounted the Sustainable Tacoma Commission's (STC) April meeting activities and then delivered new notices to the Commission. New notices included welcoming new members to the Commission; updating the Commission that its letter regarding STC participation on the Environmental Services Commission had been delivered; that Tideflats Non-Interim Regulations were moved from City Council consideration to the Infrastructure, Planning, and Sustainability Committee for recommendations by autumn; that Sustainability Small Grants Program applications are accepted for the second quarter of 2021 through June 30; that the 2020 Environmental Action Plan progress report is available on the City's website; and that the Commission's schedule to meet with City Council Members and Management is established. He also noted other happenings in the Tacoma community, including that Bike Month (May) is in its final two weeks of events and local health regulations and vaccination opportunities related to COVID-19 are changing. He pointed to resources if Commissioners or community members they are in contact with would like more information.

Staff thanked Commissioners for their work outside meetings, including subcommittees.

Subcommittee Updates

Patrick updated the Commission that it's Waste Prevention and Recycling Subcommittee is scheduled to meet on Wednesday, June 23 from 5-6pm. Interested Commissioners should engage Patrick of their Chairpersons to participate. Chair Lexi Brewer reported the Climate Action Planning Subcommittee met to discuss plans and approaches to community adaptation or resiliency planning in an effort to reflect further on staff's recent presentation to the Commission about Tacoma's Adaptation Strategy. The Subcommittee continues to work on final recommendations to staff regarding Tacoma's next climate action plan. No further updates were provided by Commissioners regarding subcommittee activities.

Commission Business Items

Welcome New Commissioners

Commissioners and staff introduced themselves to and welcomed new members of the Commission. Commissioners shared experience they bring to their service to the Commission, their lessons from participation, and points of excitement for sustainability work in Tacoma.

City of Tacoma Climate Action Planning Process Update – Patrick Babbitt, Kristin Lynett, Kyla Wilson, Office of Environmental Policy & Sustainability (OEPS), City of Tacoma

Patrick updated the Commission on recent climate action planning work, including the start of the second phase of community engagement. The second phase of engagement primarily involves virtual community workshops focused on engaging frontline community members and a general online public survey. In support of engagement work and development of a new climate plan, staff have worked with City consultants and community partners to process the

first phase of community feedback (involving input from over 450 community members) with other facts to develop practical strategies and actions to reduce climate emissions and increase preparedness for climate impacts. Climate strategies and actions, now in a draft form, are based on the best, most recent science, established City policies, and community input from this and other relevant community input processes. The second phase of engagement will inform members of the community about recent technical work, community input from the first phase, and draft actions – ultimately providing a second opportunity for community input. The process will likely lead to a draft plan, which will go to stakeholders and City Council for final consideration in the late summer and autumn of 2021.

Following planning process updates, the Commission gave input about four areas of climate strategies and actions.

City of Tacoma Climate Action Planning Draft Actions – Patrick Babbitt, Kristin Lynett, Kyla Wilson, Office of Environmental Policy & Sustainability (OEPS), City of Tacoma

Patrick and Kyla Wilson led Commissioners through a Mentimeter survey to give their input about four areas of climate strategies and actions, as well as have some discussion about community needs and priorities. Commission feedback was recorded through Mentimeter and staff notes, which will be considered alongside input from other stakeholders and the wider community.
