At the What's Happening, What's Coming in South Tacoma Open House, many of the roughly 70 attendees took the opportunity to provide input for the South Tacoma Neighborhood Plan by putting down sticky notes on display boards (see photos) and filling out individual surveys about South Tacoma's assets, challenges, and opportunities in addition to asking the Neighborhood Planning Team key questions about the planning process.


Program enhances planning and development support to help communities create strong, vibrant, and diverse neighborhoods. In South Tacoma, the Neighborhood Planning Program will soon be focusing in on priority areas for the emerging South Tacoma Neighborhood Plan derived through community

engagement (see what we have heard so far below).

The program begins with a robust community engagement phase, and then moves into implementation of key neighborhood strategies. This open house was part of the first phase of outreach efforts intended to collect feedback on Plan priorities and project ideas. The South Tacoma Neighborhood Plan Steering Group will guide the creation of draft priorities based on this feedback, which we will bring back to the community for additional feedback.

What We Heard

At the open house, we asked participants to share their ideas on the key topics we had heard so far (see below) as well as what they saw as assets, challenges, and opportunities for South Tacoma. Additionally, attendees could fill out surveys in English, Spanish, Russian, Ukrainian, Vietnamese, Korean, and Khmer. We received 2 English and 5 Spanish surveys.
