2023 Disparity Study Updates

We are finishing up contract negotiation for the consultant. The 2023 Disparity Study will look at city contracting data from 2017 to 2022 in the contract categories of Construction, Architecture and Engineering, and Goods & Services. The hope is that the consultant will be able to provide their recommendations within ten months of the study starting. We will continue to provide updates to the EIC Advisory Committee as the

work progresses and the contract is officially awarded. There will be a web page within the City of Tacoma's website specific to the disparity study for the community and the Advisory members to understand how they can be involved, as well as contact information for the EIC Advisory team as well as the consultant if you have any additional feedback for the disparity study, this page will have the necessary information.

Question: Will the disparity study look at the current climate and the legal environment that is pushing a lot of policies into chaos?

The Disparity Study will review both the EIC and LEAP Program.

At-A-Glance Program Performance Dashboard

EIC Program Staff showed a draft of the EIC Performance Dashboard. Not currently included in this dashboard:

- Distribution of contracts by department, EIC Exceptions and waiver data

2023 Information (Data through August 8th, 2023) included in the dashboard:

- Total payment to OMWBE Certified firms by gender and ethnicity
- Total payment to OMWBE Certified firms by City
- Total payment to OMWBE Certified Firm by Business Name

Requests and questions from the EIC Advisory Members:

- Questions/Requests
 - Are there Caucasian firms certified? How is that happening?
 - What is the rationale behind not counting the firms that are not certified?
 - The EIC Program only counts firms that are certified with OMWBE. We're considering opening it to other certification types for Goods & Services and A&E Contracts, but we're working on getting the data from our purchasing team.
 - Can this dashboard compare this to the overall contract spending for the City of Tacoma?
 - Seeing the full picture allows for a real conversation
- Requests
 - Add that this data is only related to Public Work and Improvement Projects
 - Compare data related to DES or WEBS
 - Please show the total amount of spending for Goods & Services and A&E Contracts
 - Kacee stated she is working on this request and will disaggregate it once she receives the data.
 - Can we see data for the non-binary firms as well?
 - Can the data be broken down by City and then Gender and ethnicity for total payments, percentage of total spend and number of awards. Please add percentage of total spend for overall spend.
 - Compare the Certified vs non-certified contract amounts
 - Break down into MBEs, WBEs and SBEs, as well as by race and gender
- Comments
 - The problem with only counting OMWBE Certified firms is that the OMWBE process is a barrier
 - \circ The EIC Program should consider other certifications in addition to OMWBE
 - There should be an extension of the program to the Goods (Supplies), Services and A&E Contracts

Overview of EIC Regulations + Advisory Member Feedback

Background of the program and review of updated items in the EIC Regulations

- **EIC Requirements Option 1:** EIC Staff applies three (3) separate requirements (MBE, WBE, SBE) in accordance with the EIC Requirement Setting Methodology.
- EIC Requirements Option 2: If after setting the EIC Requirements, reviewing the OMWBE directory and discussing with the Project Delivery Team, it is determined that fulfilling each requirement separately might present a challenge for contractors, EIC staff will apply an overall EIC Requirement. The overall EIC Requirement is the sum of the three (3) requirements initially established as a result of using the EIC Requirement Setting Methodology.

Questions:

- Where do we get our marketing research?
- Where do the engineers get their marketing? Are engineers opening their calendars to avail themselves to minority and women owned firms? (promoting their projects)
- Does the City of Tacoma have a project forecasting list?
 - Yes, we're looking to add Contact name, scope of work, Trades associated with each project
- Can EIC Staff collaborate with OMWBE to see which firms are in the certification queue so they can be aware of upcoming projects?

Overview of EIC Regulations + Advisory Member Feedback (continued)

Waiving EIC Requirements for projects with a Value of \$100,000 or less

EIC Requirements will not be set on public works and improvement projects with an engineer's estimate value of \$100,000 or less

Self-performing certified bidders

Bidders who are themselves Certified Businesses can meet the EIC requirements by self-performance. When a Certified Business is the prime bidder, an adjustment may be made to the EIC Requirements. In such cases the self-performing Certified Business can be found to be a responsible bidder even if the bid did not satisfy all three stated EIC Requirements (SBE, MBE and WBE).

More stringent Substitution Request Process to hold primes accountable.

Change orders affecting certified subcontractors will come through the EIC Office for review.

Application of EIC Non-Compliance Remedies and thorough monitoring process

- o Publish notice of the contractor's noncompliance
- o Cancel, terminate, or suspend the contractor's contract, or portion thereof
- Withhold funds due contractor until compliance is achieved; and/or
- Disqualification of eligibility for future contract awards by the City (debarment) per Section 1.06.279 TMC
