

1. Personnel

- All uniform / Patrol only
- 2. Deployment
 - Immediate department-wide / Phased approach
- 3. Policy Development & Community Engagement
 - City Council to give Citizen Police Advisory Committee (CPAC) direction / CPAC develop recommendations for Council
- 4. Vendor Selection
 - Workgroup recommendation / Stakeholder involved RFP



Personnel City Council Direction



Prioritize outward facing commissioned personnel (255 Personnel, 275 Cameras)

Patrol Officers (170)	School Resource Officers (4)	Lieutenants (11)
Community Liaison Officers (13)	K9 Officers (2)	Captains (2)
Traffic Enforcement Officers (7)	VRT Officers (4)	Chief (1) / Assistant Chief (1)
Homeless Outreach Team (4)	ACCO Officers (4)	Extra Cameras (20)
BIA Officers (2)	Sergeants (30)	

- Updated estimated annual costs:
 - o First Year: \$1.2 M; Ongoing: \$800K
- Phase-in over time remaining commissioned personnel through subsequent budget allocations

Deployment City Council Direction



 Swift rolling deployment, while accounting for capacity/ability to train in policies, procedures, equipment, and software







- Hiring and training of three redaction civilian staff
 - o 6 weeks to hire
 - 2 weeks to train
- RCW 42.56.240 requires redaction process for body worn camera recordings

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Deployment Staff Rollout Recommendation



- Rolling deployment of 255 commissioned staff over three months
- Training includes estimated 4 hours of training per commissioned staff
 - Camera system operations
 - o Policies / procedures
- Rollout to balance effectiveness, equity, costs, officer backfill, and urgency




*May require additional make-up classes to accommodate potential scheduling conflicts and time-off

 - An engagement process for public review and comment (Resolution #40618)
 - Provide feedback on body camera vendors/selection process
