I. Call to Order (5:35) Sarah Miller and Jacki Skaught were an excused absence. Kari Nathan has resigned from the Commission.

II. Roll Call/Introductions

III. Approval of Minutes (April 17, 2019)

The minutes were approved with one correction to page 3 under Commissioner Comments.

IV. Public Comment on Agenda Topics & PTAG Report Out No public comments.

V. Business Items (5:45)

- a) Tacoma Mall I-5 Direct Access Project (Feedback, WSDOT)
 - Dennis Engel, Multimodal Planning Manager for Olympic Region WSDOT, presented an overview of the Tacoma Mall I-5 Direct Access project. The project is going through the practical need solutions evaluation. This project comes directly from the Tacoma Mall Subarea Plan and a 2001 study. There was a public meeting on April 25th with an online survey. Dennis explained the various options, which includes a roundabout, adding more lanes, a tunnel, and new off-ramp to Tacoma Mall Blvd. The survey responses prioritize pedestrian safety, mobility, and connectivity; ROW/property impacts; and roundabouts are confusing. The projects next steps are to screen and evaluate the options with another public meeting in July and finalized report in the Fall. CM Gardner asked if construction impacts are being considered. Dennis stated that would be considered as part of the planning level study. CM Leighton stated that a lot of the slowing down is due to numerous driveways/access points and if staff has considered alternative solutions before adding a lane. Dana Brown explained that the project is evaluating where the trips are going and how it will contribute to a larger benefit on pedestrian access. The City has our own objectives to create a system for the Tacoma Mall area, whereas WSDOT and Federal Highways is looking for congestion management. CM Leighton brought up concerns regarding driveway placement and possibilities for closing driveways. Josh Diekmann explained that the City is aware of the number of driveways and do consider potential driveway closures as part of projects or redevelopment. Co-Chair Nyland commented about how many design ideas were inconsistent with the Tacoma Mall Subarea Plan to increase pedestrian access. Dennis explained that the ideas are brainstorming and the next step includes screening each option,



specifically for pedestrian access. CM Stevens asked if the project is considering dramatic changes, which include street closures outlined in the Tacoma Mall Subarea Plan, such as limiting access at Steele Street, or making this area less car-centric. Dana explained that reducing the volume of cars at 38th & Steele Street will allow the City to focus on making the corridor and other parts of the Subarea Plan to be more pedestrian and bicycle oriented. *Co-Chair Nyland asked what the proposed population growth for the Tacoma Mall Subarea Plan is planned.*

b) Bike and Scooter Share Program (Informational, Jennifer Kammerzell)

Jennifer Kammerzell provided an overview of the bike and scooter share program. The pilot program started as a right-of-way use permit and is in its 3rd extension. The end goal is to create a franchise agreement. An agency stakeholder committee has been evaluating the pilot program. Community engagement is planned for this summer. Concerns/complaints have been focused around speed and scooter placement. *CM Leighton asked that the Pilot Program map be updated by each mode - one for bike ridership and one for scooter ridership. CM Leighton and Co-Chair Nyland asked that the injury data be presented in comparison to industry standards and the larger scale. CM Leighton suggested that the app prompt riders to park properly, then take a photo. <i>Commission asked to clarify helmet requirements for e-bikes, scooters, and e-scooters.*

VI. Other Business/Updates

- a) Sound Transit TDLE Stakeholder Group (Justin Leighton) Next meeting is May 22nd to discuss the preferred alignment and station location. The Transportation Commission, Planning Commission, and Sustainable Tacoma Commission submitted separate letters.
- b) SR167 Bicycle & Pedestrian Steering Committee (Justin Leighton) Next meeting May 20th.
- c) Bicycle Pedestrian Technical Advisory Group (Jennifer Kammerzell/Jane Moore)

CM Gardner shared that City Council Public Comment included comments about BRT and CM Thoms was on TV Tacoma - Inside Tacoma discussing sidewalks in Northeast Tacoma and Tacoma Dome transit.

Co-Chair Nyland provided information on the Pierce County Coordinated Transportation Coalition (transportation options in Pierce County).

CM Leighton asked about the Transit Oriented Development Advisory Group resolution and the relationship between Transportation Commission. There is concern about it being Tacoma Dome focused. The resolution states that it is an advisory group that reports to the Transportation Commission. Co-Chair Moore attended the Dome District meeting, which they discussed. *Co-Chairs asked that it be an agenda topic at the June meeting.*

Co-Chair Moore shared the Short Course on Local Planning will be on June 13 (downtownonthego.com).
