1-07.23(1) is supplemented with the following:

Work Zone Clear Zone

The Work Zone Clear Zone (WZCZ) applies during working and nonworking hours. The WZCZ applies only to temporary roadside objects introduced by the Contractor's operations and does not apply to preexisting conditions or permanent Work. Those work operations that are actively in progress shall be in accordance with adopted and approved Traffic Control Plans, and other contract requirements.

During nonworking hours equipment or materials shall not be within the WZCZ unless they are protected by permanent guardrail or temporary concrete barrier. The use of temporary concrete barrier shall be permitted only if the Engineer approves the installation and location.

During actual hours of work, unless protected as described above, only materials absolutely necessary to construction shall be within the WZCZ and only construction vehicles absolutely necessary to construction shall be allowed within the WZCZ or allowed to stop or park on the shoulder of the roadway.

The Contractor's nonessential vehicles and employees private vehicles shall not be permitted to park within the WZCZ at any time unless protected as described above.

Deviation from the above requirements shall not occur unless the Contractor has requested the deviation in writing and the Engineer has provided written approval.

Minimum WZCZ distances are measured from the edge of traveled way and will be determined as follows:

Regulatory Posted Speed	Distance From Traveled Way (Feet)
35 mph or less	10
40 mph	15
45 to 50 mph	20
55 to 60 mph	30
65 mph or greater	35

3 Section 1-10.3(1)B is supplemented with the following:

4 **Uniformed Police Officer**

5 Definitions:

6 Uniformed Police Officer as used in this specification is a "General Authority
7 Washington Peace Officer" as defined by RCW 10.93.020 (3), or a "Specially
8 Commissioned Washington Peace Officer" as defined by RCW 10.93.020(5).

9 Law Enforcement Agency as used in this specification is a "General Authority
10 Washington Law Enforcement Agency" as defined by RCW 10.93.020 (1).

11 The Contractor shall arrange for off-duty Uniformed Police Officers to be present for
12 the following activities:

- 13 1. At the commissioning of a new traffic signal, or the recommissioning of an
14 existing traffic signal which has been upgraded.
15 2. Countermanding a traffic signal indication at a signalized intersection.
16 3. Directing vehicle and pedestrian traffic when a traffic signal indication is
17 turned off or is inoperative.
18 4. Where the Engineer deems it necessary for safety, including work during
19 hours of darkness.

20 It shall be the Contractor's responsibility to secure the off duty Uniformed Police
21 Officer services required by the contract, including the costs to arrange for and
22 supervise the service.

4 The services provided under the bid item "Uniformed Police Officer" shall be
5 considered a subcontractor with the attendant requirements and responsibilities.

6 The Contractor must obtain prior approval for use of off-duty Uniformed Police
7 Officers through their Approved Traffic Control Plan and approved amendments to
8 the Plan. The off-duty Uniformed Police Officer shall be in addition to all other
9 personnel required for flagging according to the approved traffic control plan.

10 A Uniformed Police Officer shall be provided in the event of accidental power
11 outages or disruption of a signalized intersection as a result of Contractor's Work
12 and remain in place until the intersection becomes satisfactorily operational as
13 determined by Agency Engineer or his/her representative.

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
