QUESTIONS and ANSWERS

This information IS NOT considered an addendum. Respondents should consider this information when submitting their proposals.

Question 1: Do they have to be installed by a licensed electrician

Answer 1: Yes, Residential Electrical 02 license is required.

Question 2: Are there any resources to help small firms navigate the prevailing wage and public works requirements?

Answer 2: Yes – there is assistance available! Our MBDA Center partners with Washington PTAC (Procurement Technical Assistance Centers) – who provide no-cost, confidential, one-on-one technical assistance in all aspects of selling to federal, state, and local governments. Question 3: How many units total is Tacoma looking to install?

Answer 3: 200-250 total. Installation preference (top of tank vs. wall mount) will be determined by cost.

Question 4: Does TPU have a sense of the density and geographic distribution of targeted customers and installation sites? For example, approximate installation counts by zip code?

Answer 4: Tacoma Power's service territory is a fairly compact urban service territory (about 180 square miles). Installations may occur anywhere within the service territory. Map included below:

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Question 5: May bidders elect to install all controllers over a condensed period (i.e. one month), rather than spread installation across multiple months?

Answer 5: Tacoma Power is willing to condense the installation period. Details will be worked out during the Preparation Phase.

Question 6: Does TPU have a targeted/estimated split between single-family and multi-family installation numbers?

Answer 6: Tacoma Power is targeting 100% single family installations. This may include a few condominiums located in multifamily style buildings.

Question 7: Is TPU seeking fixed-price bids for all 250 units? May vendors propose perunit bids, with a different per-unit price for multi-family and single-family installations?

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Answer 7: Please bid all 250 units as single family installations.
