WHEREAS, in 2023, Tacoma issued a competitive Request for Proposals PF23-0245F to select a contactor for new longer-term agreement, but the competitive selection process is not complete and the contract with Staff Pro, Inc. d.b.a. Allied Universal Security Services expired on December 31, 2023, and

WHEREAS, to provide for the uninterrupted provision of essential services, the Tacoma Venues and Events Department is seeking an interim extension of the agreement with Staff Pro, Inc. d.b.a. Allied Universal Security Services through June 1, 2024, to allow for completion of the competitive selection process under Request for Proposals PF23-0245F, and any resulting transition, and



WHEREAS the Board of Contracts and Awards has concurred with the recommendation as set forth in the attached Exhibit "A"; Now, Therefore,

WHEREAS the City of Tacoma, Department of Public Utilities, Beltline Division, (d.b.a. "Tacoma Rail"), track infrastructure in the Tidelands area is heavily used and in need of periodic upgrades in order to safely enable the switching of railcars destined for, or originating from, the Port of Tacoma and other industrial customers, and

WHEREAS Tacoma Rail was awarded interest-free Loan Agreement RRB-1296 by the Washington State Department of Transportation, in the amount of \$408,000, for the purpose of upgrading six track switches located on the Blair Peninsula, and

WHEREAS the Loan Agreement is for a ten-year term, with annual payments of \$40,800 beginning August 1, 2025, requires Tacoma Rail to contribute \$399,877 in matching funds towards the completion of the project and includes an \$8,000 administrative fee, and

WHEREAS Section 4.11 of the Tacoma City Charter requires that all matters under the jurisdiction of the Public Utility Board relating to the "incurring of indebtedness . . . shall be initiated by the Board, subject to approval by the Council, and executed by the Board," prior to acceptance of the Loan Agreement, and



WHEREAS, by adoption of Public Utility Board Resolution No. U-11427 on December 13, 2023, the proposed Loan Agreement was approved, pending approval and authorization by the City Council; Now, Therefore,

WHEREAS the City has, pursuant to chapter 84.14 of the Revised Code of Washington, designated several Residential Target Areas for the allowance of a limited property tax exemption for new multi-family residential housing, and

WHEREAS the City has, through Ordinance No. 25789, enacted a program whereby property owners in Residential Target Areas may qualify for a Final Certificate of Tax Exemption which certifies to the Pierce County

Assessor-Treasurer that the owner is eligible to receive a limited property tax exemption, and

WHEREAS Star Communities Inc is proposing to develop 10 new marketrate and affordable rental housing units to consist of:

WHEREAS the affordable units will be rented to households whose income is at or below 70 percent of Pierce County Area Median Income, adjusted for household size, as determined by the Department of Housing and Urban Development on an annual basis, and rent will be capped at 30 percent of those income levels, adjusted annually, and

WHEREAS the project will also include three parking stalls, and
